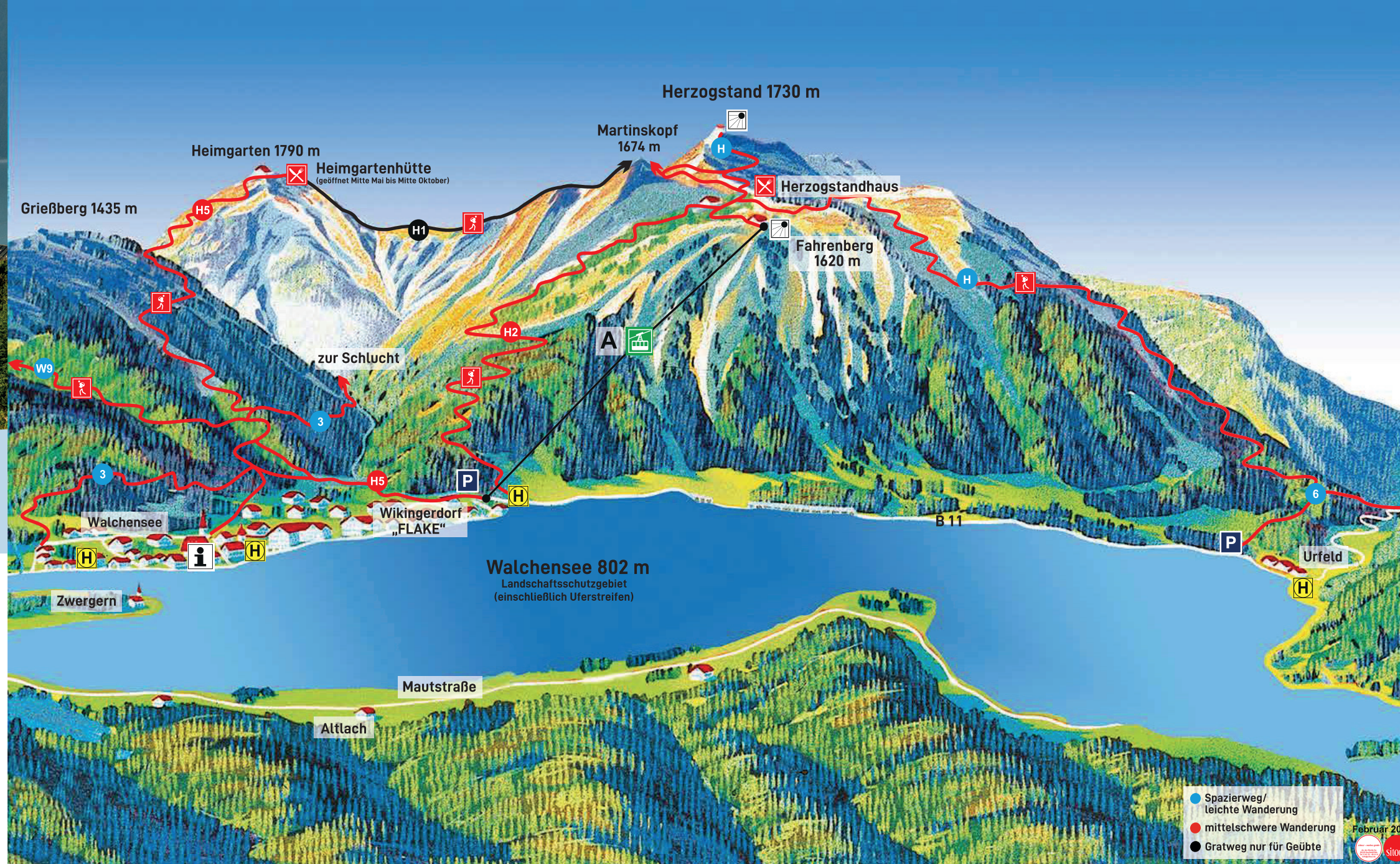

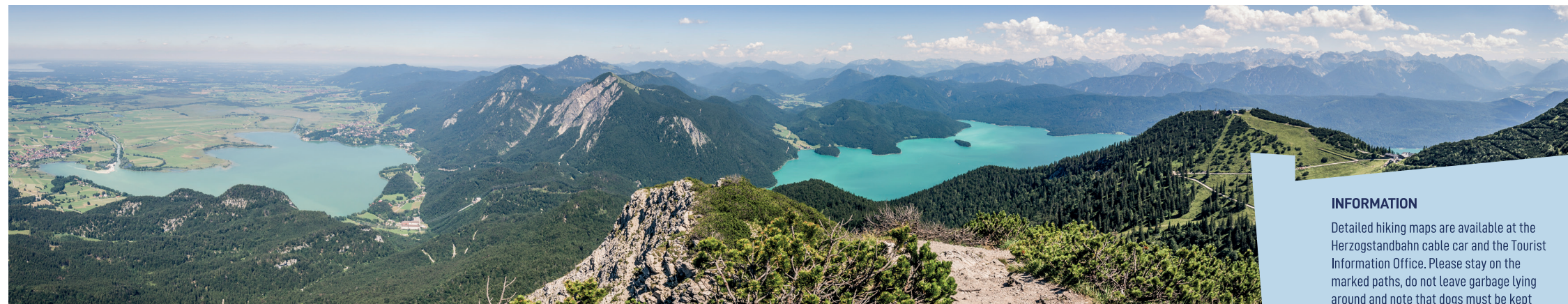

### INFORMATION

Detailed hiking maps are available at the Herzogstandbahn cable car and the Tourist Information Office. Please stay on the marked paths, do not leave garbage lying around and note that dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.

## HERZOGSTAND, THE MOUNTAIN

King Ludwig II's favourite mountain. Unmatched panoramic views across the Land of Two Lakes open up during the 4-minute ascent and when you step out of the cable car cabin at lofty 1600 metres above sea level. On the Herzogstand summit, you have Bavaria, all the way to Munich, at your feet. To the north, the 360-degree vista sweeps from the expansive Bavarian foothills of the Alps across the mountain lakes, Kochelsee and Walchensee. From there it continues to the towering chain of Alps in the south, from the proud summit of the Zugspitze across the Karwendel range far into the Tyrolean mountains. This overwhelming panorama is what made Herzogstand the favourite mountain of "Kini", the nickname of King Ludwig II.

While painters like Lovis Corinth and Franz Marc preferred the two lakes, the fairy-tale king liked to reign high and proud. He used the bridle path he had created to reach his beloved mountain and spent the night in the royal house. That later burned down, but was rebuilt. Today, it houses the mountain rescue service, among other things. He would climb up to the pavilion on the summit, from where he was able to take in the majestic vista. A monument was built at the top to commemorate the 100th anniversary of his death.



### The best peaks come in threes: Fahrenberg, Martinskopf and Herzogstand

The ride up on the Herzogstandbahn cable car lets you admire three peaks at once – or a different one each time. After reaching the top station, you can climb up Fahrenberg and visit the King of the Castle's memorial chapel. Another path takes you from the mountain lodge to the top of Martinskopf and yet another to the summit of Herzogstand.

### The mountain for families

Be it a nature trail, a climb to the summit or simply a leisurely stop for a bite to eat and drink – Herzogstand is the perfect mountain for the whole family. Other advantages: just a 4 minute ride to the top, reasonably priced family tickets and the ability to transport foldable prams. With a length of 2.5 km and easy terrain, the panoramic path with a nature trail is perfect for a leisurely walk with the whole family. It offers ever new impressive panoramic vistas of the mountains and lake with plenty of benches for a rest. The geological theme path gives both young and old an opportunity to learn about the gigantic shifts in the earth's crust, which can be seen particularly well on Herzogstand. The route described in a separate flyer starts directly at the top station and can be walked with no significant elevation change.

## WALKING / HIKING PATHS

### Hiking/Walking Path H2 – walk up from Walchensee

In summer, those who prefer walking to taking the cable car can hike up the steep path with serpentine leading from the valley station, through the forest and up to the alpine lodge in about 2 hours. From there, it's a 30 to 45-minute walk to the Herzogstand summit. Later, you can comfortably descend with the cable car.

### Hiking/Walking H – „Reitweg“

Whether uphill or downhill – the most comfortable of all paths was already laid out as a bridle path in 1866 by King Ludwig II. The trail swings up in wide curves and passes through the hollow below the summit before reaching the top of the Kesselberg pass after about 2 hours. Here, you have the option of taking a bus back to the parking area.

### Ridge walk to the Heimgarten summit H1/H5

The walk along the ridge from Herzogstand to Heimgarten takes about 2 hours and requires a head for heights, surefootedness and good footwear. This absolutely fantastic mountain experience is one of the most beautiful ridge walks in the Alps. You can rest at the lodge below the Heimgarten summit, and in summer get a bite to eat and drink. Then, you can either take the same way back to the cable car mountain station or walk down to the car park via Ohlstädter Alm (alpine pasture and cabin, not serviced) in 2–3 hours.

### GETTING THERE by car

- From Munich Take the A95 motorway in the direction of Garmisch-Part., take the exit Kochel a. See and continue on the B11 road to Walchensee.
- From Innsbruck Take the B2 road to Mittenwald, Walgau to Walchensee.
- From Füssen Take the B179 road to Reutte, Garmisch-P., then Walgau to Walchensee. There is a large car park directly at the valley station of the Herzogstandbahn cable car.

### JOURNEY by railway and bus

- If you are coming by public transport, you can take Deutsche Bahn (German Railway) to Kochel via Tutzing and then take the RVO bus, Linie (No.) 9608 Kochel – Garmisch-P. (Haltestelle = Stop: Walchensee-Herzogstandbahn).
